Trench 1 very little earth above rubble which contained a number of shallow depressions, which might be the base of postholes but do not form any regular pattern see p 6 for Tr 1 cont.

Trench 2 Continued all Friday. Towards ~~west~~^{west} the rubble is not far from surface but uphill near ~~east~~^{east} it gets ~~more~~ deeper, & it looks as if the trench was laid out ~~down~~^{down} main access which eroded quite a bit to rubble. This access would then have cut Trench 1 east but not Trench 1. This is to be tested by extending Trench 2 uphill (2 east)

At 4.0 m @ 9 m in rubble - near surface at 4.5 m it has dipped ~~in~~^{up} to 12 cm but on S. side = shallower surface. At 6.0 m it is 24 cm below surface on east & 12 cm or west & there appear a few quartzite blocks = the blue soil & a bank reddened from quartzite right in rubble. At 7.2 m it is about 18 cm deep on ~~surface~~^{surface} a slight less ~~in~~^{up} but there does not appear a true trough as if the old path crossed line of modern trench. There is no satisfactory indication of an eroded access = the rubble up to the top end of Tr 2 east at 10 m from base line, much rubble getting harder = harder down down see p 6

Tracing round the ~~west~~^{south} side of dog's den there are a few very small depressions which could be the sockets of pillars but they do not form a good pattern. Two much bigger depressions, one is quite shallow to rubble, the other quite deep occupied by the stump of a dead alder. Trench 2 east. ~~Se~~ fairly deep pit in rubble in extreme ~~SE~~ corner. The trench extended about 50 cm further & 2 wire tracers set out to see if we can cut a light or gate or obstacle each 1 m long at 9.5 - 10.5 m @ 7 m @ 27-28 m @ 7 P point. No trace of any thing seen possibly a set of median stones in centre of the pit in the rubble. Trench 1 cut out 135-155 m east @ 0-1 m @ 9 P point. At 16.5 m east the rubble which had been on same level as lowest part of Trench 1 runs into a sharp step c 4 cm high a ~~cut~~ ^{small} of this sort was the 5 cm hole tent. There is no sign of such a step ~~cut~~ ^{small} of this = Trench 1, only several very shallow depressions in the rubble 10-15 cm across. Just ~~cut~~ ^{small} of this step - a marked shallow depression in the lower rubble. Trench 1 was redeclared to see if there was any step in the rubble & there is not.
